Introduction

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Grade Levels and Competency Breakdown

Grades 1 and 2, Grades 3 and 4, Grades 5 and 6

For all grade levels, we recommend a balanced rotation through all five CASEL competencies: Self-Awareness, Self-Management, Social Awareness, Relationship Skills, and Responsible Decision-Making. This ensures that students receive a well-rounded SEL education.

<u>Note</u>: All pre-reading questions, post-reading questions, class activities, worksheets, and metacognition questions are provided within the platform, ensuring a zero prep advantage for teachers.

Lesson Structure



Option 1:

- 1. Pick a SEL Experience Book
- 2. Pre-Reading Questions
- 3. Read the Book
- 4. Post-Reading Questions

Focus on Pre-Reading Warm-Up Prompts and Post-Reading Debriefing to introduce and summarize the lesson.



Option 2:

- 1. Pick a SEL Experience Book
- 2. Read the Book
- 3. Class Activity

Conduct the Class Activity to engage students in a hands-on learning experience.



Option 3:

- 1. Pick a SEL Experience Book
- 2. Read the Book
- 3. Do Activity Worksheets

Assign the Standard Worksheet Activities for individual or group work.



Option 4:

- 1. Pick a SEL Experience Book
- 2. Read the Book
- 3. Do Metacognition Worksheet or Metacognition Prompts

Utilize Metacognition Questions and Worksheets to deepen students' understanding and reflection on the lesson.

Option 5:

- 1. Pick a SEL Experience Book
- 2. Read the Book
- 3. Mix and match how is best to teach it by doing a class activity and then assigning worksheets for home, etc.

Cater to diverse readiness levels by having some students work on worksheets while others engage in discussions or class activities.

You have the flexibility to choose a book based on the specific competency you wish to focus on. You may teach the lesson using any of the five provided options or employ all five across different sessions for a more comprehensive approach. Recognizing that no two classes are the same, you can determine the most effective method. The platform is designed to support this flexibility for optimal implementation.

Suggested Lesson Sequence

To ensure comprehensive coverage of all SEL competencies, we recommend the following sequence for educators:

- 1. Start with Self-Awareness: Begin with a lesson focused on self-awareness to help students understand their own emotions, thoughts, and values.
- 2. **Next, Self-Management**: Follow with a lesson on self-management to equip students with skills to manage their emotions and behaviors effectively.
- 3. **Then, Social Awareness:** Proceed with a lesson on social awareness to foster empathy and understanding of others' perspectives.
- 4. **Follow with Relationship Skills:** Introduce a lesson on relationship skills to enhance students' abilities to build and maintain healthy relationships.
- 5. Lastly, Responsible Decision-Making: Conclude the cycle with a lesson on responsible decision-making to guide students in making ethical and constructive choices.

Continue this rotation to cover all competencies comprehensively.

Flexible Adjustment: Educators can adjust this sequence of competencies based on specific classroom needs or incidents. For instance, if a bullying incident occurs or is suspected, a lesson on Social Awareness can be prioritized to address empathy and understanding immediately.

Practical Implementation Tips

To help you integrate HEROES MADE lessons seamlessly into your classroom, here are some practical tips:

- 1. Set a Routine: Establish a consistent time each week for SEL lessons. This helps students know what to expect and look forward to.

Grade 3-4 (Adjust up or down based on class readiness)

Lesson Title: My Circle of Control Competency: Self-Awareness

Sub-Competencies:

- Integrating personal and social identities (SA)
- Identifying one's emotions (SA)
- Linking feelings, values, and thoughts (SA)
- Experiencing self-efficacy (SA)

Components: The following methods will address the competency and subcompetencies using the lesson they just read as a reference:

- 1. Option 1: Pre and Post Reading Questions
- 2. Option 2: Class Activity
- 3. Option 3: Printable Worksheets (can also be assigned as homework)
- 4. Option 4: Metacognition Questions
- 5. Option 5: Mix and match components by conducting a class activity and then assigning worksheets for homework, or any other combination that suits the classroom needs.

A variety of questions and prompts are provided for each component. Teachers can select any combination that fits their classroom schedule or use all if time permits.

Follow-Up Plan: After teaching the lesson, either:

- Revisit the same lesson using a different component in the next class, or
- Move on to the next competency by selecting a new lesson.
