Why do students need support?

The college essay is more important than ever due to the Supreme Court's ruling on affirmative action and the move toward test-optional and test-blind admissions A 2016 study found that less than half of teachers had taken a college class focused on teaching writing, while fewer than a third had received training on teaching students how to write

Surveys show students lack confidence and experience with personal narrative writing While the American School Counselor Association recommends a studentto-counselor ratio of no more than 250-to-1, the national average in public schools is 415-to-1



Below, you will find your essay evaluated for Ideas & Content; Organization; Voice, Style, & Language; Grammar & Usage; and Length.

Ideas & Content

Level: Excellent The essay offers a focused, engaging sense of an experience, place, person, and/or event. The writer offers meaningful insight and reflection that demonstrate the topic's significance in their life. The essay clearly responds to the specific essay question or topic.

Level: Satisfactory

Level: surgisectory The essay offers a clear description of an experience, place, person, or event. The response would be strengthened by further developing ideas through meaningful insight and reflection that demonstrate the topic's significance in the writer's life. The essay somewhat response to the specific essay question or topic, but there is room to clarify the connection between the response and the essay question.

Level: Developing The essay begins to describe an experience, place, person, or event, but lacks clarity and/or specifics. There is room to reflect upon the meaning or importance of the topic so that the reader can appreciate its significance in the writer's life. The essay does not yet align with the specific essay question or topic.

Level: Satisfactory

You have the beginnings of such a nuanced, vulnerable and dynamic personal college essay. You've laid a lot of important groundwork in this draft, and expressed some of the foundational themes and experiences in your narrative. Now it's time to really hone in on how those experiences, how they have changed you, and most importantly, how your reflections have given you new insight into who you are and who you are growing to become

Reflection can give us new insights into our experiences, and you have started to reflect deeply on your relationship with your brother as it pertains to your familial relationships and challenging experiences. Remember that the primary objective of this essay is to demonstrate personal growth and then reflect on the insights gained form that growth. You want to not only show growth and self-reflection, but to do so in a way that demonstrates your value to a college community. In this draft, you have identified a key part of your identity that has affected who you are and how you move in the world. Now it's time to get specific about the experiences surrounding this part of your identity that has catalyzed your growth.

You mentioned in your intake form that you weren't sure if this essay says enough about you. I think there is so much thoughtful and heartfelt writing here about an experience that was deeply impactful to who you are - and that says a lot about you! I think one key opportunity
