Founded in 2000, the FACE Project (Functional Approach to Character Education) is a 501C3 nonprofit organization whose mission is to promote positive social and emotional learning, build character, identify responsible behaviors and foster a healthy school environment.

The FACE Project is a unique Character Education program that is comprised of:

- A research-based and comprehensive teacher curriculum, integrated within the Virginia Standards of Learning (SOL).
- A research-based and comprehensive school counselor curriculum, integrated within the Standards for School Counseling Programs in Virginia Public Schools.
- A teacher and counselor-friendly curriculum that is developed by educators for educators.
- A curriculum that will help with classroom management and school-wide incentives
- A curriculum that offers 38 weekly lesson plans per grade, preschool through 5th grade that focus on learning tolerance, empathy, respect and celebrating differences.

School professionals are offered in-service training with follow-up consultations to enable teachers and counselors to institute a program that is designed around a comprehensive Character Education curriculum, featuring weekly, individualized lesson plans for preschool through fifth grades.
