Growth through Connections Advancing Literacy Scores By Connecting Phonemic Awareness and Phonics

With literacy scores in decline nationwide, Pentucket Regional School District beat the odds to increase elementary reading scores by implementing Heggerty district-wide and enhancing teacher knowledge of the Science of Reading.

THE SITUATION Literacy Scores in Decline

In 2018, Assistant Superintendent Brent Conway and his team recognized a problem—reading scores were on the decline. The data revealed that students' phonemic awareness skills were not strong. A phonics program alone was not enough.

According to Conway, "It's not that we weren't teaching phonemic awareness, but it wasn't being done systematically across all classrooms in the same way. So we wanted something that was consistent."



Why Phonemic Awareness?

Phonemic awareness (PA) is the ability to understand that spoken words are made up of individual sounds called phonemes, and it's one of the best early predictors for reading success. Kids who don't master phonemic awareness will inevitably struggle to learn to read.

Within their first year of implementation, 92% of Pentucket Kindergarten students passed the "at-risk" mark on the DIBELS Next assessment for phoneme segmentation fluency, far exceeding the 70% the district had reached in prior years.

The intentional connection between phonemic awareness and phonics instruction also enabled growth in word fluency metrics.

"Heggerty was really the big difference," says Conway.
