Working professionals serve as subject matter mentors, creating connections between the classroom and the real world.




Professional Learning

Educurious offers immersive professional learning for teachers, as well as district and school leadership. We help educators understand the principles and learning science of project-based learning, implement practices that motivate students, and develop a culture that nurtures

project-based learning.

Curriculum Progress

Since our founding in 2011, Educurious has expanded the number of courses and professional learning services we offer, and significantly grown the number of districts, schools, and students we serve.

Curriculum

We expanded our offering of high-quality, standards-based, digital, project-based learning curriculum.

- Middle School Science: Educurious now has a full suite of 6th, 7th, and 8th grade NGSS-aligned full-year science courses. Students, teachers, and administrators from school systems across the nation have provided overwhelmingly positive feedback.
- Middle School Social Studies: We completed the development of middle school social studies full-year courses. Content in these courses covers ancient and medieval world history and U.S. history from the American Revolution through the Civil War and Reconstruction. We are in the process of adding text sets to the ancient world history course with corresponding text-dependent close-reading questions.
- Custom Curriculum: We are proud to be uniquely positioned to design custom curriculum for our partners. We concluded a project with the National Geographic Society that involved the development of 29 middle school project-based science and social studies units for their Education Resource Library. We also developed a professional learning course for the National Geographic Society. There are plans to develop elementary units and a series of skillbuilders to support both the Educurious-developed units and the National Geographic Geo-Inquiry process.
- Special Projects: We partnered with Soulphia, a business in the New York/New Jersey area that employs people experiencing homelessness as English speaking tutors for aspiring women business leaders in Portuguese- and Spanish-speaking countries. Our team created hundreds of conversational classes that are being used to support the growth of English Language Learning (ELL) adults who are looking to improve their conversational English skills.

Professional Learning

We expanded our offering of immersive online and in-person professional learning opportunities.

- With funding and support from the Idaho STEM Action Center, Educurious concluded the second cohort for the Idaho STEM • Leadership Academy professional development series. Final sessions in the program were conducted online due to COVID-19. Due to the success of these initial two cohorts, Idaho STEM Action Center is seeking funding to support a third cohort.
- All professional learning opportunities are now available in hybrid or online formats. We developed online courses for • professional learning including curricular onboarding sessions and sessions to support PBL unit design. These synchronous and asynchronous courses integrate online learning strategies to develop teachers' agility and flexibility across learning environments.
- Educurious developed an online leadership course, Leading Through Times of Change, a blend of synchronous and • asynchronous learning for school system leaders. This is scheduled for launch in 2021.

Accomplishments

Educurious had an active and exciting year, working collaboratively with schools, districts, partner organizations, and communities to help launch young people into lives of purpose and hope.

- This was Educurious' founding member Jane Chadsey's first full year in her role as CEO. Related to this change in ۲ leadership, Educurious went through a process of organizational restructuring to more clearly define roles and pathways for growth. Changes that resulted from the restructuring process included creating new Director, Content Manager, and senior Designer roles. This new structure will streamline the work at Educurious as the organization continues to grow.
- Our work was largely informed in the second half of the year by the global health crisis presented by COVID-19 and the ۲ groundswell of the Black Lives Matter movement. These two pandemics inspired several critical pivots in our work. When COVID-19 shook the global community in March, Educurious pivoted to supporting teachers with the immediate need for remote and hybrid learning. We developed a framework for adapting Educurious curriculum to the remote-learning environment and provided related support to our partners. We also migrated all professional learning online, including our annual Summer Institute.
- Shortly after the outbreak of COVID-19, the murder of George Floyd launched a surge of support for the Black community ۲ and challenged everyone to consider their role in racial justice and equity. Educurious published a Statement of Solidarity and Commitment to Anti-Racism that can be found on our website, and began taking steps to upholding that commitment.
- In conjunction with our pivot to remote learning and commitment to anti-racism, we selected three units to adapt for online ۲ instruction that told the story of Black history in the United States from the Transatlantic Slave Trade through Civil War and Reconstruction. We have formed a consortium of educators investing in the professional development needed to implement them successfully. Once they are completed, Educurious intends make these adapted units available as Open Education Resources.
