Purpose of Overview

School districts nationwide are looking for solutions to address the social, emotional, and academic student needs resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. Fortunately, many are finding answers in high-dosage tutoring. In fact, study after study provides consistent evidence that **high-dosage tutoring leads to significant improvements in learning outcomes for a wide range of students.**

Tutoring's Transformative Impact

For school districts that want to address unfinished learning there is one intervention that stands out from the rest: **high-dosage tutoring.** There is strong evidence that high-dosage tutoring consistently leads to large improvements in academic achievement, and also helps improve social and emotional outcomes.

- An analysis of 14 interventions to improving student achievement found that high-dosage tutoring was the most effective.
- High-dosage tutoring helps students gain an additional two years of math comprehension² and an additional year of understanding in English language arts—on top of classroom learning.³
- Students who participated in high-dosage tutoring for at least one semester grew to proficiency at a rate of 80%, compared to 45% for students without assistance from Varsity Tutors.

Implementing Effective High-Dosage Tutoring

High-dosage tutoring shows clear, positive results. Research from the Annenberg Institute at Brown University⁶, the J-PAL at MIT⁷, and the CRRE at Johns Hopkins⁸, identify **four common criteria of effective tutoring programs** that school districts should follow. Varsity Tutors for Schools makes them easy to implement with our evidence-based solution.

What to watch out for

Relying on bots, tutors-on-call, and chat-based programs to offer homework help removes the benefit from relationship-based tutoring and student-teacher rapport.



Embedded in the School Program

What to watch out for

Tutoring programs exacerbate educational inequalities if schools do not take an active role in connecting students with tutors. Many students who would benefit from tutoring are unlikely to sign up for tutoring on their own.
